

# Disable User Account Control

This document will describe the process of disabling UAC (User Account Control) in Windows Vista. UAC is a security measure within the Vista operating system that forces users that are part of the local administrators group to run like they were regular users with no administrative privileges by popping up a confirmation box anytime an action requiring administrative privileges is performed.

Although UAC clearly improves the security on Windows Vista when compared to previous Windows operating systems, in some scenarios you might want to disable it, for example when remotely controlling and administrating your mission critical transmitter remote control.

## Using MSCONFIG

1. Launch MSCONFIG by from the Run menu.
2. Click on the Tools tab. Scroll down till you find "Disable UAC". Click on that line.
3. Press the Launch button.
4. A CMD window will open. When the command is done, you can close the window.
5. Close MSCONFIG. You need to reboot the computer for changes to apply.

Note that you can re-enable UAC by selecting the "Enable UAC" line and then clicking on the Launch button.
